# Catholic Social Teaching -

"Option for the Poor and Vulnerable" The Catholic Church proclaims that we must put the needs of the poor and vulnerable first.

- JJN's Dr. Georgiou Literacy Collaboration project is moving forward and teachers are being trained in literacy intervention strategies.
  - Currently, we have 5 interventionists working with 3 to 4 students, 4 times per week (30 minutes each session);
  - Administration, the school librarian and an educational assistant are providing coverage while students are pulled out for these intensive sessions;
  - Students remaining in class are being exposed to oral reading, storybooks and other phonemic awareness focus activities.
  - Parent teacher interviews for grade 1-6 students will be held virtually this

term and have been scheduled for the evenings of October 19 and 20.

The ONLINE book fair runs October 13 to 25: (The link will activate on October 13) virtualbookfairs.scholastic.ca/pages/5150793
All books purchased online will be sent to our school (free of charge) after the book fair closes. We will probably receive these orders in the first week of November.

### • The IN-SCHOOL book fair runs October 14 to 21:

Students will preview the book fair on October 14 and 15th. They can bring money to their preview to purchase books and posters. All classes will come back to the book fair the following week during their library class and be able to shop at that time.

If items are sold out, students can do a 'student re-order', they pay for the out of stock item and their item should be received at the school on October 27th.

Money raised from the book fair will be used to buy new books and supplies for our library. Book fair flyers were sent home this week

### • Halloween Dress Up Day - October 29:

This year, on Friday, October 29, grade 1-6 students are welcome to wear Halloween costumes to school. We ask that students not wear make-up or masks and that no props be brought to school.

# Covid – 19 Update

 On Thursday September 30, Premier Jason Kenney strongly encouraged all school Divisions to consider the implementation of a Vaccine Mandate for staff.
Following this announcement, Education Minister Adriana La Grange and Health Minister Jason

- proof of vaccination policies for adults in the schools. As a result of this request, and to provide the safest possible working and learning environment for all staff and students, GSACRD will be implementing a mandatory proof of vaccination.
- Starting on December 17, all GSACRD staff will be required to be fully vaccinated or present acceptable proof of a negative COVID-19 test within 72 hours of starting each workday, unless they require an accommodation pursuant to a protected ground under the Alberta Human Rights Act.
- The Administrative Procedure for a safe working and learning environment for all is a collaborative approach of many including: ATA Local, CUPE Local, UNIFOR Local, members of the College of Alberta School Superintendents and the Alberta Teachers Association as well as our Division's Legal Council.
