Updated Compassionate Friends Procedures

Compassionate Friends is a parent council committee that helps support and assist JJ Nearing families that are in need or crisis. When there is a need to support a specific student and/or family the school administration will then contact Compassionate Friends. All of the family's information will remain confidential.

A google document was sent out to all of the JJ Nearing parents/guardians for an opportunity to volunteer. By signing up the parent/guardian has volunteered to be part of the compassionate friends list. Depending on the needs and support required, the contributors on the google form list will be contacted to assist in helping a student or family. This will include donations such as gift cards (ex. skip the dishes, restaurants), household essentials, family experiences, and other various items. All of the donations given will be anonymous. Although they may have signed up to contribute, there may only be a certain number of people contacted at one time so they may be called upon at a future date. The items/gifts can be collected through the school office to keep them safe and secure. The donations will then be gathered and distributed to the families.

I also wish to request a slush fund for Compassionate Friends of \$200. This can go towards purchasing gift cards/items to support a family/student if needed immediately. (rather then having to purchase personally then submit a receipt to be reimbursed at a later date)
