10. Committee Reports

- **A) Yearbook** no report we need to find a second person to shadow Gage this year and take over next year. Janessa knows a grandma of a kindergarten kid and she will talk to Gage.
- **B)** Compassionate Friends Ashley connected with Marina and there is a family to touch base with with a small gift basket due to a medical emergency. There will be another family in January that will be in need.
- **C) Partners in Prayer** First meeting in October, next meeting is planned for November 4. I would like to ask Family & Friends for \$130.00, for gift cards for teachers.
- D) Major Projects Committee Playground The Playground Development/Redevelopment Application Form has been submitted to the city. Once that comes back, we can approach contractors to get a cost estimate. The longer we wait on building, the more the cost goes up. -The city agrees that we should be targeting around \$200,000 for the north/small playground, with the School Community fundraising between \$50,000-\$80,000 for it. The rest will ideally come from grants, which very commonly get approved. From talking with the city, it's rare they don't. - We generally raise around \$10,000/year in our fundraisers, which would take us at least 5 years, for our 2-5 year lifespan park. And that's with 100% of fundraising dollars going to it, none going back to the school and current students. That is not the route we will be taking, so we can make sure we let parents know that. - Tier names (Friends \$100-\$249, Angels \$250-\$499, Patrons \$500-\$749, Founders \$750- \$1000. Will create a top group, if we happen to get a bunch above the \$1000 level. - Mark will work with the new Families & Friends group to help facilitate ways to come up with new revenue sources for the park, to help make the realistic goal of 2023/2024 happen. - Mark will work with the school admin to get a sponsorship/donation letter setup. - The city also suggested we get the kids involved in the planning, to create hype and excitement. They suggested going to each class and asking what they want to see and what they like/don't like. Could be the Playground Committee, or just the teachers. We need to make the kids and their families, especially the younger ages, excited and motivated for this.

We talked about the different grants that we are allowed to use now as well as the idea of a 50/50 cash fundraiser.

Committee is currently falling onto Mark because he is the chair and there is no one else who is interested. If you are interested in doing this committee, please contact Mark Kay. This position is open.

The playground redevelopment application form was submitted last week to the city. This is the first official step to start this process.
