ATTACHMENT 2: FAMILIES & FRIENDS REPORT

F&F of JJN UPDATE - FEBRUARY 2023

Our bank balance is currently \$13,949.79. In addition, we should be receiving our January Healthy Hunger payment of \$748.80 shortly.

At our last meeting, we committed to giving the school up to \$1,500 for unique math games and \$3.500 for Chromebooks.

We also voted to purchase a JJN t-shirt for every student to encourage school spirit, at a cost of up to \$4,000. We offered the option to parents to order shirts for themselves at cost to and did have some take us up on that. These have just been ordered through Sportfactor and we are hoping to have them in about 4 weeks.

We hit a snag in ordering the JJN banner that was discussed in previous council meetings as the cost is actually double what we were initially told. We discussed the actual amount in our meeting and agreed to go ahead with it at a cost of \$525 and it has been ordered through Sportfactor.

Our Pink Shirt sale is complete and shirts were sent home with students this week. We did not mark up the shirts much as we intended the sale as more of a convenience offering, rather than to make a large fundraising profit. That being said, we sold 42 shirts for a small profit of \$62.40.

In our January meeting, how best to support the Playground Committee was discussed. We passed a motion to earmark \$1,000 of our bank balance for the playground as a start to their fundraising. The second was a motion to allocate any future fundraising profits for the rest of the school year, with the exception of Healthy Hunger hot lunch income, to the Playground Committee. We are currently running an Easter Purdy's fundraiser and have been working with the playground committee to identify other ways we can raise funds this year.

Hot lunch has brought in a total of \$4,159. to date and all the hot lunch dates to the end of the year have been scheduled.
