F&F of JJN UPDATE - MAY 2023

Our bank balance is \$11,409.49 with \$10,491 earmarked for math games, iPads/Chromebooks, FitSet Ninja and Playground Committee, leaving us with a total of \$918.11. We are waiting for April's Healthy Hunger payment of \$1,452.90.

Next week we will collect and tally the Word-A-Thon funds together with the playground committee. The students will have their reward day corresponding to the amount raised. We did not have a meeting in April as we didn't have anything to discuss, and will have our next meeting May 25 at 2pm.

Playground Committee Report May 2023

Playground Committee is going forward with getting some digital renditions of our new park we are fundraising for. We are going to be asking 3 different companies to provide 3 estimates and their ideas. We briefly chatted with Marina to discuss the playground size and decided that we will expand our playground from its current L shape to become more of a U shape and expand into the field a bit. Jen is working on our website for PC so that we can have a visual for any parents, sponsors and students looking for information. F&F has been so great to work with this year and they have donated \$1000 to account to start our fundraising efforts and put together a Purdy's fundraiser to benefit the playground. Currently, a Word-A-Thon is happening with proceeds going to playground. Our current balance is \$1816.38. Thanks F&F!!

We have decided we will try and fundraise enough to put in our first application September 2024 as it takes 8 months for it to be approved.
