F&F of JJN UPDATE - September 27, 2023

We held our AGM and first monthly meeting of the year last Tuesday.

Our new executive was voted in and this year we have Ashley Reichert joining us as VP.

We are in full planning mode to host our Freaky Friday Fall Ball coming up on Friday the 13th. We are hopeful it'll be well attended like it was last year. Tickets are on sale now through the Healthy Hunger site. Admission price is \$20/family which includes a drink, chips and glow sticks.

We have submitted our application for insurance for the year.
