Over 90% of students, parents and staff reported that they feel children are safe, learning to care for and respect others and are treated fairly in school (AB ED survey).

Inclusive Learning: J. J. Nearing is an inclusive environment, supporting the needs of all students. J. J. Nearing staff are life-long learners, dedicated to ongoing professional development and collaborative practice.

Formative and diagnostic assessments were used to guide intervention, instruction and to assess progress.

Staff use differentiated instruction strategies, positive behaviour and academic support to ensure that all students are able to reach their full learning potential in an encouraging and supportive environment.

Foundational Knowledge of First Nations, Métis and Functional field they have the opportunity to participate in reconciliation activities that leach them about First Nations, Métis, and Inuit culture and traditions to further reconciliation (Div. survey).

Citizenship: Over 90% of students, parents and staff are extremely satisfied that students model the characteristics of active citizenship (AB ED survey). Over 95% of students feel that they are encouraged to get moded in ackivities that heby their community (Div. survey).



### Engaged Learning

Student Engagement: JJN is proud of our high results regarding students having opportunities that support engagement in school.

96.8% of students feel that they have opportunities in school that support engagement (Div. survey).

90.4% of parents are confident that JJN is a good school for their child(ren) (Div. survey).

97.4% of students feel that JJN is a very good or good school (Div. survey)..

Parent Involvement: JJN has an active School Council and Families & Friends Society; All parents are welcome to get involved.

Overall parents are satisfied with their involvement in decisions regarding their child's education.

School Improvement: 78.3 % of parents feit that the quality of education that their child experienced at school improved in the past three years, a 12% increase from last year (Div. survey)

96.5% of students indicated that their school and schools in their jurisdiction have improved or stayed the same the last three years (AB ED survey).

JJN staff receive ongoing professional development to support implementation of the new curriculum.

Staff at JJN have received professional development and resources to focus on and improve literacy and numeracy at all grade levels.

Standardised assessments are administered and analysed to guide classroom instruction and intervention.

# UPCOMING FUNDRAISER – CASH CALENDAR – AGLC Licence #666110

We will be running a cash calendar for the month of January. Ticket sales will start this Friday, November 17<sup>th</sup> with information being sent home with the students. We will sell tickets up until December 15<sup>th</sup>. Hard copy tickets will be sent home with the students on December 21<sup>st</sup>. Tickets are \$20 each and in the month of January we will draw a ticket number every day and you will win the corresponding prize written on that day of the calendar. Our hope is to sell all 800 tickets which is doable if every student sells 3 tickets and if we do we could raise \$11,200 for our new playground! Cash prizes each day are in the amount of \$100, \$200 and \$1000 for a total of \$4,800 to be won. There will be prizes handed out to the top 5 selling students and if all 800 tickets sell, there will be a school prize.

November 2023 playground report

Jen Boucher handed in her formal resignation from the playground committee effective November 2023.

Playground committee is under the umbrella of council and F&F has a portion of their bank account ear marked for us as council doesn't have a bank account anymore.

Currently we are in talks with two companies and getting their ideas to draw up a playground design. These are free for them to provide us. Once we have these, we plan on heading into the school to get the kiddos involved and get them excited.

There is a process to building a new playground and right now we are in the FUNDRAISING stage. We need to fundraiser approximately \$70,000 before we can move onto the next stage. It may seem quiet and like nothing is happening but there is a lot behind the scenes that isn't loud and flashy.
